

ewe knit

CLAUDIA'S COWL

Finished size: 57 inches long before seaming; 17 inches wide when stretched, 10 inches wide when relaxed

Materials: 3 skeins Cascade Eco Duo; 4.5 mm needle (or size needed to obtain gauge); darning needle

Gauge: 11 stitches/13 rows = 2 inches

Abbreviations:

k – knit

p – purl

RS – right side

sts – stitches

WR – wrong side

** – repeat instruction to the end of the row

RIBBING PART ONE:

Row 1 (RS): k4, *p4, k4* until 4 sts from the end, k4

Row 2 (WS): k4 *k4, p4* until 4 sts from the end, k4

RIBBING PART TWO:

Row 1 (RS): k4 *k4, p4* until 4 sts from the end, k4

Row 2 (WS): k4, *p4, k4* until 4 sts from the end, k4

STOCKINETTE SECTION:

Row 1 (RS): Knit

Row 2 (WS): k4, purl until 4 sts from the end, k4



KNITTING THE COWL

Cast on 84 stitches. Knit one row

Knit Ribbing Part One for one inch, finishing with row 2. You are now ready to work a RS row.

Knit in stockinette (as per directions) for two inches. Knit Ribbing Part Two for two inches. Knit stockinette section for two inches. Knit Ribbing part one for two inches.

Repeat ** seven times, or until almost all of your yarn has been used up. Knit one row. Bind off, leaving a long tail (at least 20 inches).

To turn this long scarf into a cowl, bring the cast-on and bind-off edges together and sew them together with the tail, using mattress stitch.

Cuddle up and stay warm!
